#### **Old Business**

- 1. Entrance signs The Board voted to approve the sign vendor's recommendation for a color change of the tree leaves on the sign. The signs will be installed soon.
- 2. Sidewalk repairs Sections of the sidewalks that need to be repaired will be marked and repair/replacement estimates will be requested from Tidewater.
- 3. Mulch along the pathway at 9753/9757 Early Spring Way The landscape company will be contacted about mulching this area.
- 4. SBCA, July 2023 June 2024 Board Elections Tidewater will send out information calling for Board candidates and how to vote.

#### New Business

- 1. Resident request to cut a tree down The Board voted against a resident request to remove a healthy tree behind the resident's home.
- 2. Dead Shrubs and mud runoff on Sea Shadow The Board voted to approve a contract proposal to replace dying yew bushes and to improve drainage causing mud runoff at the top of the stairs located at the large retaining wall.
- 3. A resident requested to have their handicapped parking permit number added to their handicapped space The Board voted to approve the request and a sign will be ordered and installed.
- 4. Reports of rats There was a report received by the Board of a dead rat found in the neighborhood. The rat appeared to have been poisoned. Please follow the rat abatement instructions found on the Howard County government website <u>https://www.howardcountymd.gov/health/rodent-wildlife-control</u> Keep all trash in cans with lids, clean up after pets, seal holes around the foundation of your home, and keep the grass cut and your yard free of debris.
